the change that had occurred, not only in their lives, but also in all of the Schreiber Center's staff.

There were tears in the eyes of several staff members, not of sorrow but of joy. They realized the work and dedication each child made to reach this milestone in their life.

21st Annual Rubber Duckie Race & Festival Makes a Big Splash

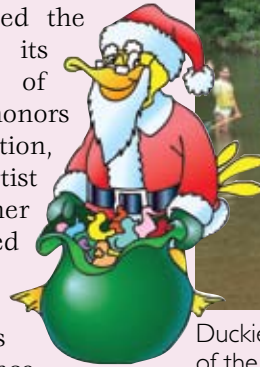

On Sunday, July 26, a **flock of almost 25,000 racers** took their mark and swam down the Conestoga River in a competition benefiting thousands of local children with congenital and acquired disabilities and developmental delays.

The Schreiber Pediatric Rehab Center's 21st Annual Rubber Duckie Race™ and Festival featured a "Christmas In July" theme, netting more than just Duckies: **over \$112,000 for the services and therapies provided at the Schreiber Center.**

Weeks of training led the winning Duckie and its owner, Joan Drake of Lancaster, to take top honors at the Race. In addition, local celebrated artist Diane Goble, donated her original Duckie-themed watercolor and proceeds totaling more than \$250 received from the work's raffle to benefit the Race and the Schreiber Center.

Duckie supporters and racers enjoyed a day of fun in the sun at Lancaster County Park beginning with the Second Annual Duckie Dinghy Derby, where teams of four rowed their way to victory down the same waters as Duckies. The winning team, The Sequined Sailors from Sequinox, were crowned top Duckie of the Race, with best costumes going to The VFW Bombers from Lancaster VFW Post 1690. Teams raised funds to benefit the Schreiber Center in a chance to compete for glory and the honor of Duckie Dinghy Derby Champion. The fun continued with a visit from the big guy himself—Santa Claus—in honor of this year's Race theme, giving little racers the chance to get a head start on their holiday wish lists.

Lucky Duckie owners Carol Engroff, Virgie Hurst, Caylin Younts, Kevin Hale, Brianna Graham, Peggy Devaney, Kathleen Radcliffe, Anthony Strother, and the Lupold Family were among the top ten, with Joe Turnowchyk taking home the honorary jar of molasses as his was the final Duckie to cross the finish line.
