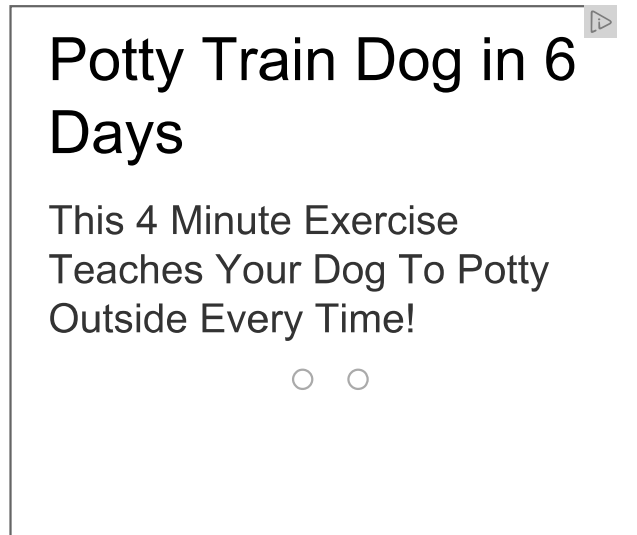

In case you didn't notice, the annual Rubber Duckie Race to benefit Schreiber Pediatric Rehab Center didn't happen this past July, as it has for so many previous years.

But no fear, the race and festival have now moved to September - this Sunday to be exact, at Lancaster County Central Park.

The festival begins at 2 p.m. while the race of 20 thousand rubber ducks floating down the Conestoga River, kicks off at 5 p.m.



Each duck has a human ‘owner’, and winning ducks earn their humans some wonderful prizes.

This year, duck owners have more chances to win with the race within the race of the blue ducks. These higher priced ducks (\$20) will be vying for 10 special prizes.

This is also the first year for an entirely new flock of ducks. The old ones had hand-written numbers inscribed on them. The new ones come already numbered and ready to race.

Ducks cost \$5 for one; \$10 for a quack pack of three; \$25 for a Lucky Duckies 7-pack; and \$50 for a Daffy Dozen. Or you can buy a flock of 25 for \$100 and get an event t-shirt and poster.

Whether or not you purchase a duck for the race (which you can do by visiting Schreiber [here](http://www.schreiberpediatric.org/ducks/) (<http://www.schreiberpediatric.org/ducks/>)), visitors can still enjoy the festival’s pony rides, face painting, food and fun, plus get to experience the excitement of seeing so many duckies clog the Conestoga.
