From the Desk of James DeBord, Schreiber President

Endowment nears milestone

A central part of our mission at Schreiber, maybe the most important part, is that we don't turn away anyone who comes to us for services. It says it right in our vision statement:

Enriching lives. Giving hope. For all who need us, every day.

"For all who need us." But you might not know exactly how we manage that. When I talk about Schreiber, I will usually mention the low reimbursements from insurers and the fact that so many of our families (94 percent), regardless of household income, are eligible for medical assistance. MA provides even smaller payments for services.

We deal with that in the short term by raising money, more than \$1 million each year to cover the hole in our budget from those low reimbursements. We are also taking steps to secure our long-term future by building the Schreiber Endowment Fund. We started the fund in 2014, and without any major campaign and while raising money for daily operations, we have managed to set aside about \$800,000.

Our goal is to reach \$1 million by the fund's fifth anniversary in June. We are excited to announce the Atlee Hall Drive to \$1 Million Challenge. Atlee Hall, a Lancaster law firm, has provided several generous contributions to Schreiber in recent years, and they pledged \$10,000 to kick off the endowment fund campaign. We set a deadline of June 30 to reach our goal. So if you want to invest in Schreiber's long-term financial security, [make a contribution to the Drive to \\$1 Million Challenge](#). MORE GREAT NEWS

If you come to the center in the next few weeks, you will see lots of construction. We are **converting our Multipurpose Room into a new treatment area** and **building a quiet room to give therapists more space to work**. We are also creating a new intake room for our families to meet with our Family Support Coordinator. On top of all that, this spring, we will start work to renovate our front entrance. The goal is to make it a brighter, more welcoming space for the families who come into our building.

As always, that we can continue to maintain our high level of services across the center and make improvements to our campus is only possible with the generous support from friends like you here in Lancaster County and beyond. Thank you again for all you do for Schreiber and the children and families who depend on us every day!

Meet the 2019 Schreiber Ambassadors

Every year, we select a group of kiddos to serve as our Schreiber Ambassadors and have their stories help us tell our story to supporters. Each of the kids in this year's group receives at least three services here. These are services that don't exist anywhere else in central Pennsylvania, and without your generous support these services would go away and the lives of these kids and thousands of others would be much different. Here are this year's Ambassadors.

Matthew Denlinger, 6, suffered from a traumatic brain injury as an infant, and his parents did not know then what his future held. Matthew has been coming to Schreiber for several years to receive occupational, physical and speech-language therapy. He has learned to climb stairs and ride bikes, to sing, answer questions and interact with friends. His bright, smiling face has become a familiar one at Schreiber. He and his parents live in East Lampeter Township.



Christopher Hong, who will be 18 in March, was born with Down syndrome. He has been coming to Schreiber since he was a student in the S.T.A.R.S. Preschool and now receives occupational and speech-language therapy as he prepares for future vocational work. He has also regularly attended Club 625 events and Camp Schreiber for several years and, his therapist noted, has some awesome dance moves. He and his parents live in Lancaster Township.



Everett Lee, who just turned 5, was diagnosed with autism. He attends Schreiber's S.T.A.R.S. Preschool and receives occupational and speech-language therapy. Everett has made so much progress with his language skills, and he is much more adventurous with his eating. His therapist said he's a talkative social butterfly who is funny and pleasant. He and his family live in Elizabethtown.



Bailey Welton, 5, was born with spina bifida and a number of other serious physical challenges. She receives all three therapies at Schreiber and works on sitting up, holding things, eating and head control. Her greatest achievement so far has been taking her first steps in a gait trainer in physical therapy. One of her therapists said she's hardworking, funny and willing to work. She and her family live in Manor Township.



Introducing a parenting program for kids with autism

Schreiber will offer a new parenting program called Incredible Years, and it will be tailored specifically for parents raising children diagnosed with Autism. The program will **start Wednesday, March 6**, and **run for 11 Wednesdays until May 22**. Sessions will run from 6-8:30 p.m. There will be no session April 3. Child care will be provided.
