From the Desk of James DeBord, Schreiber President:

Our Work Continues...

We talk a lot here at Schreiber about the generosity we've seen from our friends in the community during the past few years. It truly is what sustains us. We could not continue to operate without your support.

Sometimes, it's worthwhile to take a step back and take stock of how much we've been able to accomplish thanks to you. Often the benefits are not obvious if you just walk through the center occasionally, or if you haven't visited for a few years.

I'll give you a couple of examples. When I started here in 2012, I met with our IT consultants. They told me then our servers were on the "verge of collapse." Thanks to the generosity of numerous individuals and foundations, we were able to raise over \$250,000 to replace long outdated servers, buy new laptops and computers for our therapists and upgrade our billing and scheduling software.

We constantly try to provide the finest cutting-edge resources for our therapists to use in their work with the kiddos we see. Some of the equipment we have can be expensive. Thanks to two separate gifts, one from Highmark and the other from a very generous couple choosing to mark their wedding anniversary with a gift to Schreiber, we were able to add two high-tech treadmills, each of which cost about \$15,000, in our Physical Therapy gym.

Meanwhile, in our Speech-Language Therapy Department, we took space that used to be a waiting room for parents and turned it into additional treatment rooms for more therapists. We see more kids in Speech Therapy than in any of our core services, and this extra space and new therapists have allowed us to increase the number of kids we see and to drastically decrease wait times.


Many of you are probably aware of the infant room we opened in August 2017. That happened as a result of a \$250,000 gift from the Donald B. and Dorothy L. Stabler Foundation, a gift that was then matched by you and other friends in the community.

We're in the process now of raising a similar amount of money to build a new front entrance, one that will be brighter and more welcoming, and without the low overhang that has caused more than a few tall vehicles to leave their mark on our building.

Our work continues. Our need to raise more money continues. But as I look back, I see how much you have helped us accomplish. On behalf of all of us here at Schreiber, thank you.

An Ambassador's Story: Kami Appleby

Kami Appleby is a 2-year-old bundle of blonde, blue-eyed cuteness. She has been coming to Schreiber since July 2016. Kami was less than a year old when she became ill with transverse myelitis, an inflammation of the spinal cord. The illness, which attacked her neck, left the previously healthy baby paralyzed from the neck down.



She has worked through physical and occupational therapy to regain her lost mobility, increase her core strength and improve her fine motor skills. Her mom Juliann says Kami now has enough strength to walk with the aid of a walker (anyone who attended the Schreiber Gala in March was a witness to Kami's frequent toddling around the ballroom) and will soon be using forearm crutches.

"Kami has had a wonderful experience so far at Schreiber," Juliann says. "We are so thankful to her therapists for always trying something new with her, to push her farther in her recovery. We truly feel like it's a team effort to help her, and we are blessed to have such an awesome team."



Kami works with Megan Campbell Roland in Physical Therapy and Jessica Krueger in Occupational Therapy. Their skilled work has helped Kami regain a lot of what she lost due to her illness. Danielle Brenneman's first son Miles was born with cerebral palsy. He received services from Schreiber starting with early intervention home visits from Schreiber Physical Therapist Kristie Schroeder when he was 6 months old, and began at Schreiber's S.T.A.R.S. Preschool when he was 3. Dani was so happy with all of her experiences, she sent two more boys — Levi and Issac, both typically developing — to Schreiber, too.



"I love it here," Dani said. "It's so good here. Everybody gets you. They understand what you're going through. And everybody is so friendly and so accepting."

Miles received occupational and speech therapy, along with continuing his PT. He was with Jay Graver in preschool for two years, and he was joined the second year by his younger brother Levi. Miles eventually graduated from preschool to start kindergarten. He's 6 now. Levi and Isaac still attend Mr. Jay's preschool.
