## Dr. Galloway, Creator of Modified Toy Cars for Children with Special Needs, to Visit Schreiber

Kids just want to have fun, and pediatric researcher and designer Dr. Cole Galloway wants to make sure that all kids have that opportunity.

That's why he launched the GoBabyGo project in 2006 with Sunil Agrawal to provide mobility to kids who have trouble moving on their own.

Dr. Galloway started with custom robot-driven devices and later began modifying off-the-shelf toy cars and mini-jeeps to provide mobility to children with crawling and walking difficulties, empowering them to be part of the action at home, in the daycare center and on the playground.

Dr. Galloway discovered that for \$200 he could purchase a \$100-ride-on car from Toys 'R' Us and \$100 of Home Depot supplies to create an easily operable vehicle for children with physical impairments. He realized he had found an alternative to the power wheelchair, which can cost well over \$1,000.

"Fun is key here—it unlocks brain development and exploratory drive for the child, and ignites active, engaged play from adults and peers," Dr. Galloway says. "When your main goal is mobility and socialization of young children and their families, you can't ask for better collaborators than Barbie and Mater."

Since taking the first ride-on car off the store shelf and modifying it with nuts and bolts, Dr. Galloway has thereafter mobilized hundreds of children with disabilities all over the country.

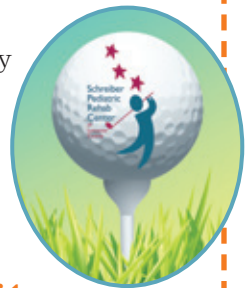
### 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Fall Craft Show
