

Many of you have probably seen or heard about our intention to expand

our building on Community Way. As you read this, hopefully we will have received approval from East Hempfield Township to move forward with our plans to build a three-story, 20,000 squarefoot addition.

Why do we want to expand? The reason is simple: We are out of space to meet the current demand for our services.

How we make it happen is a little more complicated.

The estimated cost of the project is \$7 million: \$6 million for construction, and another \$1 million for our endowment to cover the ongoing costs of managing our larger space and hiring more staff. That \$7 million will be a record amount of money for Schreiber to raise.

And we will have to do it while continuing to raise the \$2 million we need every year to serve every family that walks through our door every day. Any decline in that fundraising puts enormous pressure on us to maintain the services that are so important to so many.

You can expect to see us doing the work we do every year: from this week's Schreiberpalooza concert event and our Gala in March, to the revived Buck-a-Cup Campaign and Softball Weekend this spring, to this year's Rubber Duckie Race, which kicks off this year with a new Ducks and Trucks event here at Schreiber in June (see the details on page 3).

At the same time, we will be launching the capital campaign to raise the funds we need for expansion. As we're preparing to do all of that, we are also launching our new behavioral health program, set to open in March, because there's a need for those services in the community.

From the first day Edna Schreiber opened her clinic 84 years ago this month in February of 1936, this organization has been meeting the needs of the most vulnerable among us.

We begin 2020 filled with excitement and anticipation of what's ahead. These next two to three years will be particularly challenging. We are grateful for all of you who have been with us so far, and we know that with you traveling next to us we will continue to make Schreiber a treasure for all of central Pennsylvania.




Jalaya Cooper
