

## **COVID-19 Screening Protocols for Entry Schreiber Center for Pediatric Development**

All Guests to the building will be screened:

- Are you or anyone in your household experiencing any symptoms consistent with COVID-19
  - If anyone in your household is experiencing symptoms, even if that person is not present, you should not enter the building
- Are you aware of having been exposed to COVID-19
  - If you have knowingly been exposed to someone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 you should not enter the building
- Temperature of 100.4 or higher will be denied access
- Temperature of 99.4 or higher will be asked more specific questions about current wellness

All guests entering the building will be asked if they have had exposure or symptoms in their household, and temperatures will be taken. The following specific screening questions will be taken asked if clarification is needed to the broader inquiry on health and exposure:

- Have you or anyone in your household experienced a fever of 100.4 or higher over the past 24 hours?
- Have you or anyone in your household experienced symptoms consistent with Covid 19 (cough, sore throat, fatigue, headache, body aches, diarrhea, loss of taste/smell, etc.) over the past 24 hours?
- Have you been directly exposed to someone confirmed or highly suspected to have Covid 19 within the past 10 days?

If answers to any of the questions are yes and/or if the temperature is 100.4 or higher, they will be denied access to the building.

Families are encouraged to self-screen prior to coming to the Center to avoid being turned away for their appointments. They can cancel their appointments due to illness or exposure with no ramifications.

An individual who is asymptomatic and has been in direct contact (15 minutes of exposure within 6 feet without PPE) with someone confirmed to have Covid 19 will be denied entry to the Center for 10 days from date of last exposure if no symptoms or after 7 days from exposure if a Covid test yields negative results.

If an individual becomes ill at the Center, they will be required to leave the Center immediately and any area they have been will be thoroughly sanitized and ventilated. They will be allowed to return to the Center when they can answer negatively to the screening questions, or if/when negative Covid 19 test results are provided.

If an individual has a positive Covid 19 test or is highly suspected by their physician of having Covid 19 they may return to the Center after at least 24 hours since recovery (no fever without fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms) AND at least 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

If an individual has a positive Covid 19 test and has no symptoms, they may return to the Center when at least 10 days have passed since their first positive test result.

### **Accompanying a Child to Therapy:**

- One adult (parent, caregiver) is permitted to accompany a client to his or her therapy session.
- Siblings are allowed to enter the building if alternative childcare is not available. If siblings are in attendance, the adult and siblings must remain in the waiting area during the session and are not permitted to enter the treatment area.
- On a case-by-case basis requiring approval of management, additional adults may be permitted to attend sessions if the attendance of additional adults is in the best interest of the client.

### **MASK Requirement:**

- Masks are required of all guests to the building age 2 years and older.

- Face shields are considered an acceptable alternative for those clients who are unable to wear a mask due to a medical condition.
- Masks may be removed during individual treatment sessions based upon the discretion of the treating therapist in such cases as: speech therapy, feeding therapy, aquatic therapy.
- Clients who continue to have trouble with wearing face coverings will be addressed on a case-by-case basis with focus during treatment sessions on building tolerance.
- All individuals in Circle of Friends Academy Childcare Program and S.T.A.R.S. Preschool Program are required to wear masks when inside the building.
