As Yogi Berra once said: It's like déjà vu all over again.



Building a more diverse workforce

In January, Schreiber and Penn State announced a partnership to establish a new scholarship fund at Penn State. The two organizations each pledged to contribute \$275,000 to the fund, and the money will be used to award a scholarship for a student from an underrepresented community pursuing a master's degree in speech-language pathology at Penn State. Schreiber made the first two payments toward fulfilling its pledge, representing a total of \$137,500 to date. The university awarded the first scholarship in May to Anicia Anderson. Volunteer Spotlight

Allison Neff started as a Schreiber volunteer because she has an eye for landscaping. She had dropped her daughter, Isabel, off at preschool a few times when she happened to notice the bushes by the front entrance were looking a little untended.

"I just thought, 'Man, that's kind of annoying. And it doesn't look very nice. I can do something about that,'" Allison said.

She ran the idea past Lisa Moore, our front desk receptionist, who put Allison in touch with Susan Fisher, our volunteer coordinator, who quickly said yes.

Allison brings her daughter to Schreiber for all three therapies. Isabel was diagnosed with periventricular leukomalacia, a kind of brain damage that is often the cause of cerebral palsy, which was also part of Isabel's diagnosis. They have been coming to Schreiber since

Isabel was 3, and Allison says her daughter has made so much progress.

So, after drop-off, instead of leaving, Allison grabbed her tools (she used to work for a landscaping business) and started pruning the holly bush and the cherry tree that are next to the portico. Then she looked for other bushes to clean up.

"The two and a half hours that Isabel was in school, I was trimming," she said.
"I knew I could help. I wanted the place to look nice for the therapists that helped my kid. They've helped her come so far. It's my way of giving back."




