What more is possible?

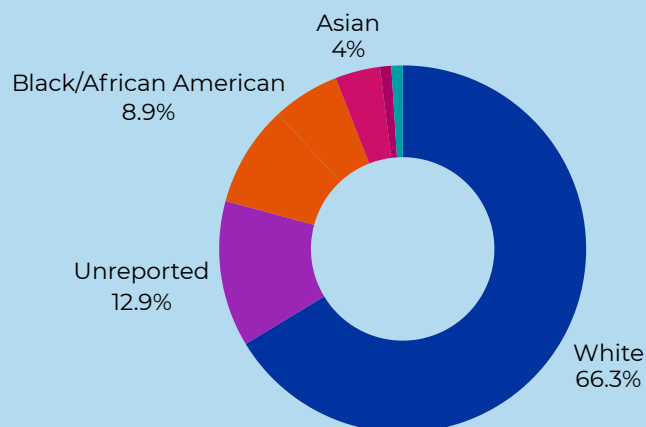
As you read this impact report, I hope you see not only what we accomplished in FY26, but the people behind that progress and the possibilities ahead.

Ninety years is a remarkable legacy. It is also our foundation for the future. Together, we will build on it—creating new possibilities for children and families for generations to come.

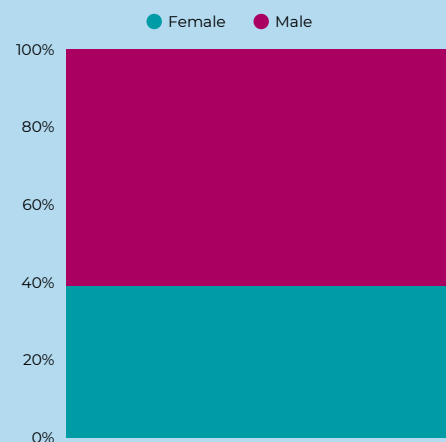


Who We Serve

Client Race & Ethnicity



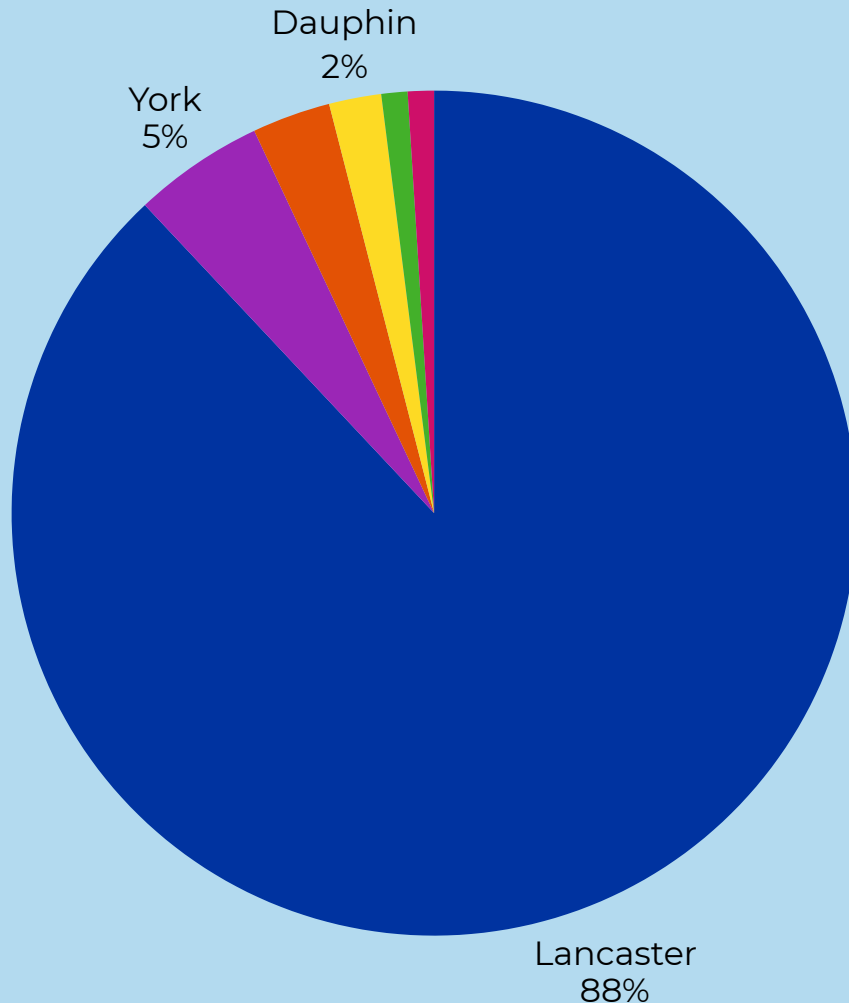
Gender

Therapy Services

Every hour of therapy at Schreiber represents progress—a new skill learned, a challenge overcome, or a step toward greater independence. Throughout FY26, our therapy team partnered with children and families across a wide range of needs, providing individualized care designed to help each client reach their fullest potential. The numbers that follow offer a snapshot of that work: who we served, the therapy we provided, and the children who reached important milestones and were ready to take their next steps beyond our care.

Discharge Summary

Our discharge results reflect the progress clients and families make throughout their time at Schreiber. In FY26, 85% of clients discharged successfully completed services, demonstrating the impact of individualized therapy and strong family partnership. The remaining discharges were due to noncompliance (10%), changes in medical status (2%), referrals to another agency (2%), and relocation from the area (1%).

Early Childhood Education



S.T.A.R.S. Preschool

48 children attended S.T.A.R.S. Preschool, learning and growing together in an inclusive environment. Children with and without special needs learn side by side—building friendships, developing empathy, gaining confidence, strengthening academic skills and independence, and establishing a strong foundation for a successful transition to kindergarten.

Circle of Friends Academy

41 children found a place to learn, grow, and belong at Circle of Friends Academy: 7 infants built early developmental foundations, 14 toddlers gained independence and confidence, and 20 preschoolers strengthened skills and friendships for the next stage of learning.



Recreation Programs



Independent Activities of Daily Living:

22 teens gained confidence and greater independence through the IADL program, building life skills such as meal preparation, household management, community navigation, and other tasks preparing them for a more independent future.



Respite: 160 children enjoyed safe, engaging, and inclusive Respite Nights at Schreiber, giving children with special needs and their siblings opportunities to play and connect while providing caregivers valuable time to rest, recharge, and enjoy peace of mind.



Schreiber Sibs: 27 siblings found connection and belonging through Schreiber Sibs, building friendships with peers who understand their unique experiences while strengthening confidence, self-expression, and the understanding that they are not alone.



Adaptive Swim Lessons: 50 children built confidence, independence, and water safety skills through Schreiber's Adaptive Swim Lessons, receiving individualized instruction designed to meet their unique abilities and help them feel more comfortable and successful in the water.

Finding Their Place

For many young people, growing up means discovering where they belong and what gives them purpose. For teens and young adults preparing to transition beyond Schreiber's care, that journey can bring both excitement and uncertainty. Through programs like Club 625, Artist-in-Training, and Modern Band, Schreiber is creating meaningful pathways forward—places where young people can explore their talents, build confidence, form lasting connections, and discover how their unique abilities can become part of a fulfilling future.



60 teens and young adults connected, built friendships and grew in confidence through **Club 625**, enjoying inclusive social activities like dances and outings in a safe, supportive environment where every participant could feel valued and included.



Through a partnership with ASPIE Artists, the inaugural **Artist-in-Training** cohort empowered 4 clients to develop their artistic talents, create work for public display, and gain real-world experience—culminating in the sale of their artwork at a live auction in April.



Schreiber's **Modern Band**, The UnSinkables, empowered 6 young adults to take the stage in six performances, building confidence, self-expression, teamwork, and collaboration while experiencing the pride and belonging of making music together.

Summer Camps



Camp Schreiber

41 campers of all abilities built friendships, explored new interests, and stayed active through sports, fitness, arts, music, and other inclusive activities.



Club 625 Camp

31 teens and young adults strengthened social skills, built friendships, and gained confidence through engaging activities and community outings.



Food Discovery Camp

14 children explored new foods with greater confidence, using sensory activities and hands-on food preparation to build a more positive relationship with eating.



Music Therapy Camp

9 young campers used interactive music and play to strengthen communication, social skills, memory, and body awareness.

Generosity in Action

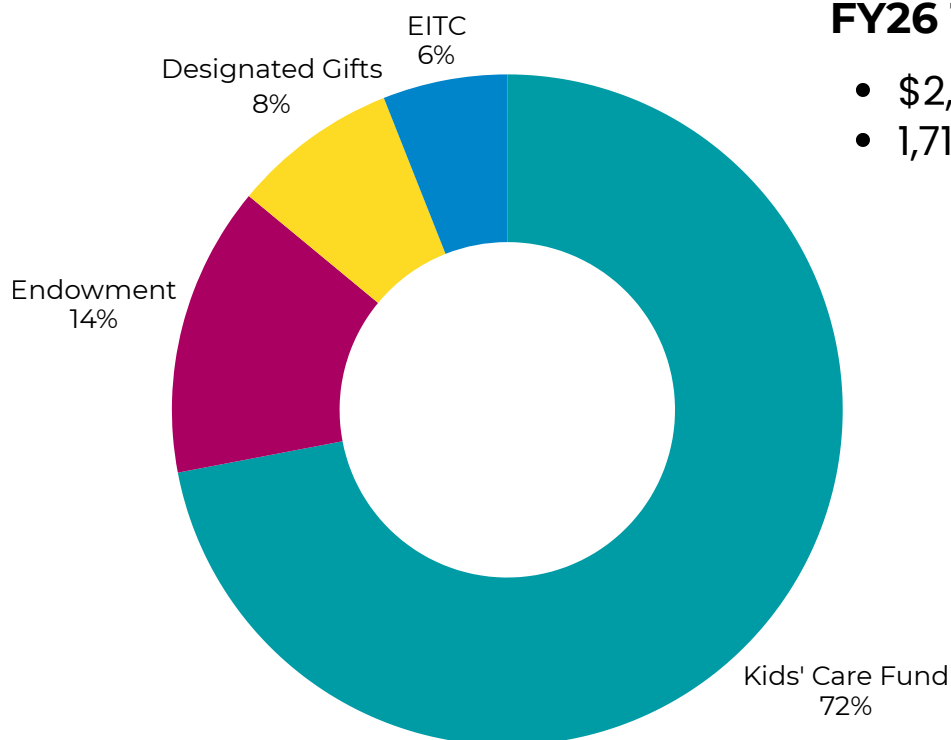
Every gift tells a story of someone who believes in what children can achieve.
